Homework Tasks

Choose one task each week. Colour in the star when it's complete!

English tasks:

Write a recount of an exciting weekend

Can you include different time conjunctions such as first, then, next, finally etc. Remember to include punctuation and state opinions about your day. Try and use 'because' to give a reason.

Write a story set by the sea

Use the setting of the seaside to write a creative and imaginative story. This could be about a strange or exciting day at the seaside or you could write imagining you are a sea creature.

Word search

Make a word search using words from the seaside e.g. sand, shore, ice cream and bucket

Spellings

Using the spellings at the back of your book create some interesting silly sentences. Can you include capital letters, finger spaces and the correct punctuation? Try and challenge yourself to include simple and compound sentences.

Science tasks:

Draw a picture of a flower and label key features such as stem, leaf and petal.

Go on a plant hunt around your neighbourhood. Can you list the different plants and explain where you found them.
