

Week 1 and 2 - Time Capsule Project

Some extra ideas for learning at home. Have a look and choose some to try with your child.

Literacy

- Children could write a fact file about themselves. You could include information on; their families, pets and homes, favourite hobby, TV programme, book and character.
- Children to draw pictures of their favourite things that they have such as toys, books, food, drinks.

Maths

- Can the children go on a shape hunt around their homes - write/draw objects the objects they find and make a list to show what we have in our homes today.
- Compare the objects they find by exploring size and weight and placing them in order. Take photos to evidence.

Understanding the world

- Can the children talk or write about their families - who they have living with them. How old are their siblings/parents etc?
- Explore what differences and similarities they have with the members of their family?
- What would people of the future want to know about us now?

Physical Development

- Children could practise cutting skills for objects to go into their time capsule.

Expressive Arts and Design

- To create a time capsule that will look exciting that can hold things in, you could use old boxes, envelopes, card to create a container.

Creating a Time Capsule

In future years to come people might want to know about us. Can we create a time capsule to show what our lives are like now?

PSED and Communication & Language

- Children to talk and write about why they are special. What makes them different from others?
- Do the children have special hobbies, skills or activities that they love to do.
- Can the children talk about how they are feeling?
