Tues	To use similes	<p>Input: Watch the daily video from Mrs Sutcliff and Mr Button. The Hare ran as fast as a cheetah- what do you notice about this sentence? Did you spot the simile? A simile is a literary device that directly compares two things to show the similarities between the two - a simile will include the words "like" or "as". If you would like more information you can visit this website: https://www.twinkl.co.uk/teaching-wiki/simile Task: Describe how the Hare and the Tortoise move using similes. Use your imagination; could other animals be involved? For example: The rabbits bounced as high as a kangaroo whilst watching the Tortoise.</p>

Weds	Write the problem of the Hare and Tortoise fable	<p>Input: Watch the daily video from Mrs Sutcliff and Mr Button. Recap what an adverb and simile are. Can you identify the adverbs or similes in the sentences below? - Hare ran towards the tallest tree as quick as a cheetah. - Tortoise showed perseverance as he patiently walked around the course. What are the key events in the middle of the fable? 1) The hare roared off, stopped and looked back 2) Hare went for a little nap in the sun 3) Tortoise was slow and very steady. He walked towards the finish line and by night time was almost at the finishing line. Task: Writing the problem of the story (Hare and Tortoise) – continuing from where you got up to last week.</p>

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Fr	Ending of the Hare and the Tortoise Fable	<p>Input: Watch the daily video from Mrs Sutcliff and Mr Button. Today you will be writing the ending of the Hare and the Tortoise. It will be important to include fronted adverbials, adverbs and similes to make your ending exciting and interesting for your reader (or listener). Here is an example:</p> <p>As the day turned into night, the crowd became excited. “Tortoise might actually win!” explained the Badger. The crowds moved towards the race track and cheered. Suddenly, Hare woke up to the loud cheering.</p> <p>Worrying about what was happening, Hare glanced towards the finish line and he saw the Tortoise close. Hare began to panic and grumbled, “I can’t let the Tortoise win.” He stood up and quickly brushed all the leaves and twigs from his silky fur.</p> <p>Task: Write the ending of the story (Hare and Tortoise)</p>
