You may need to do some estimating, some calculating and some research.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) There are roughly 10/500/1000 million domestic cats in the world. 2) On average, cats weigh 1.5/4.5/8 kg. 3) There are roughly 400/600/800 million domestic dogs in the world. 4) Adult elephants need to drink about 100/200/400 litres of water a day. 5) A giraffe's neck is about 120/170/220 cm long. 6) On average, male lions weigh 180/250/330 kg. <p>Once you have estimated these, check on the internet – were you correct?
