


Can you.....?

- Practise your number bonds to 100 when there is a 5 in the ones digit e.g. 35+65
- Add 3 digit and 3-digit numbers for example: 145+126=
- Add 3 digit and 4-digit numbers for example: 145+1045=
- Add 4 digit and 4-digit numbers for example: 1241+1465= You can watch Miss May's demonstration on how to use column addition. This will be found on the Year 4 home learning page.

Investigation:

In this maze there are numbers in each of the cells. You go through by adding all the numbers that you pass. You cannot go through the cell more than once.




Can you make it through the maze with a score of exactly 100?

Addition Word Problems

- 1) Miss May has 245 multilink cubes in her classroom and Miss Lloyd has 568. How many do they have altogether?
- 2) Mrs Miller and Miss Cummings have been counting the flowers around the school. Mrs Miller has counted 668 and Miss Cummings has counted 328. How many have they counted in total? Try writing some of your own addition problems and then solve them?

Use the digits 1 to 9 (only once) to make three 3-digit numbers. Your mission is to make the total as close to 1500 as you can.
