Baseball is a popular sport in the USA can you find out how it is different to rounders (the similar game in the UK) and play a version of baseball with your family in the park?


Football is as popular in South America as it is in the UK – can you try and do some football 'tricks'? Try to challenge yourself to achieve something new.


North and South America
