Outcome

The children will have a strong understanding of the events that occurred during WW2 and the effect on the people of Britain. During the topic the children will study the reasons for the outbreak of WW2, the Blitz, rationing, blackouts, D Day and VE day.

Children create a war diary, imagining they were there at the time. They will include various forms of writing including diaries, letters, information leaflets and instructions.

They will visit Newhaven Fort, where they will participate in workshops related to WW2.

At the end of the topic, they will take part in VE day celebrations in which they will participate in a range of war time activities.
