TOP TIP: use *has* or *have* in your sentences.

Example: Little Red baked some cakes for her Grandma (past tense)

Little Red has baked some cakes for her Grandma (present perfect tense)

2. Jack, a young boy on a local farm, disappeared up a giant beanstalk.
3. Hansel and Gretel were found wandering around the dark forest.
4. A vicious wolf, who lives in the forest, ate Little Red's Grandma.
