Salt Dough Diva Lamps

A diva lamp is an oil lamp that is typically associated with Divali, the Hindu Festival of Lights. The word Divali means "row of lamps." Divali, the Hindu Festival of Lights, is celebrated in the months of October and November. It is described as being one of the most important Hindu festivals, as well as the most popular.

You can make salt dough the day before you want to make the Diva lamps or on the day.

You will need:

250g of plain flour250g of salt1 cup of water (add slowly until you get a smooth dough)Add to a bowl and mix well.

You then need to make the dough into the lamp shape.



You can wait for them to air dry or put them in the oven at 200 degrees for around 20 to 30 minutes. They need to be hard in order to hold a tealight. The lamps may need longer or shorter depending on your oven. Keep a close eye on the lamps.

Once they are cooked, let them cool down and then paint your Diva lamps or leave natural.
