I would like to start off the newsletter by thanking you for your continued support over the past fortnight. Unfortunately, we have had our first positive cases within the school and I can appreciate how unsettling this can be for children, parents/ carers and staff. As a school, we are continuing to adhere to government guidelines and are implementing the four control measures. These are: maintaining good hygiene, increased cleaning, ventilating classrooms/spaces and following advice on testing. The whole school celebration assembly , on a Friday, will continue to take place via zoom. However, we will continue to regularly review the situation based on the current government advice and make the necessary amendments where required.

Whilst times are feeling a little uncertain, we are still continuing to provide our children with a broad and balanced curriculum, immersing them in their learning. Our year 6 children enjoyed their Evacuation Day linked to their World War Two topic of 'Battles, Bombs and Bravery'. They took part in Operation Pied Piper where they were evacuated from Southwick to Fishergate and were met by their host families. The children looked incredible and we would like to thank staff, pupils and parents/carers for making this day a memorable learning experience for all.

Miss Johnstone took a group of year 5 and 6 children to a Tag Rugby competition at Shoreham Academy. As always, the children behaved impeccably and worked extremely well as a team.

In other news, Mrs Groves (our Reception teacher) has been working with a not for profit organisation called Tree Action CIC to fundraise for a water pump to be installed and additional trees planted in our Forest School woodland area. We have very nearly reached our target so would like to thank you all for your donations.

This week, we have had visitors from our Academy sponsor, REACh2. Time was spent talking to leaders in charge of Early Reading, PE, RE, Maths and History about our curriculum offer in these subject. They spent time in classes, speaking to pupils and looking at the wonderful work produced so far. COVID Information for Parents

Symptoms of COVID-19

The government recommends that if your child has any of the three main symptoms (see below) associated with COVID-19, then it is advisable to order and take a PCR test. Your child will need to remain at home until they have the test result back and are not allowed visitors. They may leave the house to have the PCR test.

The three main symptoms are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Tracing close contacts and self-isolation

Close contacts will now be identified via NHS Test and Trace and education and childcare settings will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.

As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with the positive case to identify close contacts. Contacts from a setting will only be traced by NHS Test and Trace where the positive case and/or their parent or carer specifically identifies the individual as being a close contact. This is likely to be a small number of individuals who would be most at risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of the close contact. You may be contacted in exceptional cases to help with identifying close contacts, as currently happens in managing other infectious diseases.

Individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case and any of the following apply:

- they are fully vaccinated.
- they are below the age of 18 years 6 months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test. We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so.

Children who are aged under 5 years old who are identified as close contacts will only be advised to take

a PCR test if the positive case is in their own household.

Staff will continue to take twice weekly lateral flow tests
