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Dear All

It has been lovely to welcome so many families into school for the first of our termly parents/ carers' consultation evenings. We are very conscious that we only get to see certain aspects

of your child at school and, therefore, find it incredibly valuable to meet with parents and gain a different perspective. Following the meetings we have had several messages of thanks for everything that individual staff are doing that goes 'over and above' the norm. The meetings also give us a chance to address any concerns before they become an issue and we really appreciate being given this opportunity to work with our families.

Large numbers of parents and carers also attended the coffee morning organised by Mr Trower on Reading and Phonics. It was fantastic to see so many people at the workshop learning a little bit more about how we teach phonics at school and how families can help with reading at home.

Reception parents were also in school for the first Book Look of the year. This gave them an opportunity to share the work their children had completed since arriving at the school in September. The comments made by parents about how well the children had settled in were really lovely to read.

Our pupils have continued to represent the school in a number of ways. One group of year 5 children have started a project with residents at a local care home, working together to produce art work and creative writing based on the Shakespeare play The *Tempest*. This follows a very successful link with the local Hospice earlier in the year.

Both netball and football teams have been out to compete with local schools and as always left staff and family feeling very proud. There have also been more judo successes for pupils in our school and for some who have moved onto secondary school having started to practise the discipline here.

WOW days have also continued with Year 3 enjoying all things Egyptian and Year 5 visiting Hampton Court to learn more about the Tudors. Thank you for your support with these important experiences. Overall attendance is now very close to our target of 96%. We are however starting to get more requests for term time absences. We realise some absences are unavoidable but it would really help if families didn't book holidays in term time. We cannot authorise any holidays in term time as the expectation is that holidays are taken within the 13 weeks of holiday time across the school year. In line with our locality schools we can only authorise exceptional absences such as one day for a close family wedding.

As you all know school attendance is incredibly important as it can have an impact on both your child's learning and their friendship groups. Our school target is to be at least in line with national figures: 96%; anything lower could have an impact on our Outstanding judgement.

Each week classes have the opportunity to win attendance awards for the best attendance. Well done to the following classes:

w/ending 8th November 2019

KS1 1st place with 99.5% is 1MS, KS2 1st place with 99.1% is 6SG

Whole School Attendance w/ending 8th November = 94.8%

w/ending 15th November 2019

KS1 1st place with 99.3% is 1AT, KS2 1st place with 99.4% is 6HS

Whole School Attendance w/ending 15th November = 96.5%

Overall school attendance currently stands 95.9%

Term Time Absence As more and more requests are made for term time absences we would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that we **cannot authorise** holidays in term time. As a school we pass the details of these absences onto West Sussex County Council. (This is for any holiday

which lasts 5 days / 10 sessions or more.)

Additional details can be found on their website, including the following information: The Government has directed that headteachers may now only grant leave for a holiday in termtime where there are exceptional circumstances. In West Sussex, we may issue a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) if a pupil has accrued unauthorised absence from school and the school has referred the matter to us.

Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN) are issued per parent, per child and are an alternative to prosecution, giving you an opportunity to discharge your criminal liability by paying a fine of £120, which must be paid within 28 days.

They are generally issued where there have been at least 10 sessions of unauthorised absence from school within a recorded 10 school week period. However, there are some occasions where they are issued outside of these criteria.

Should the period of absence for a holiday in term time be 15 school days or more, a FPN may not be deemed suitable. Instead the matter may be brought directly before the court.

After 28 days we will consider prosecuting for the original non-attendance, not for the nonpayment of the FPN, however if you pay within 21 days we will reduce the fine to £60.

Paying a Fixed Penalty Notice

You can pay online using the reference number stated on the FPN. A unique reference number for each child will be provided.

Anti-Bullying Week


